To the Candidates, Sponsors, and Parents:

Over the next few months, you will be doing much reflecting, sharing, praying, celebrating, caring, and growing as you all prepare for Confirmation. Confirmation completes the process of initiation into the Church and sets the newly confirmed on the way of Jesus.

The activities contained in this booklet are designed to encourage your family's participation in the Catholic faith. It allows your family to explore the works of the Holy Spirit in your everyday life. Some activities will be shared in class and sent home at that time. The faith shared, the questions to be raised or answered, cannot be "crammed" into an hour or two. You must have time to reflect on, pray about, and thoroughly consider what you discover about yourself, your family, and your faith community.

These faith sharing activities will have numerous activities that need to be completed by the candidate, sponsor, or family. Each activity will have instructions for the family, links to additional resources, and questions for family reflection. Please review this book and its deliverables every month.

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Activity 1: Sponsor

- **Step 1:** Parents with your teen list people in your lives that have a visible strong faith and then review the Sponsor information (pg. 7) from the Resource Book
- Step 2: Candidates choose a sponsor and arrange a time to speak (in person, phone, email) to discuss the questions below
- **Step 3:** Candidate completes the worksheet

Discussion Questions with Sponsor

- 1. What do you remember about your Confirmation?
- 2. Since being Confirmed what has been your most influential faith moment?
- 3. Tell me about an experience in your life when it was difficult for you to be Catholic- perhaps a time when you were made fun of for your faith or when you struggled with a teaching of the Catholic Church. How did you keep your faith or find answers to your questions at that time?
- 4. Who has been your role model for you to live out your Catholic faith? What has he or she taught you? How has he or she challenged you?
- 5. Where do you see God in your daily life? When and how do you most feel His presence?
- 6. In what ways do you still need to grow in your faith? Do you try to keep learning? How?
- 7. What is the best thing about being Catholic? What is the greatest challenge to being Catholic?
- 8. What advice would you give me in becoming an adult in the Catholic faith?
- 9. Ask your sponsor to provide a verification form from his or her church.

Give your Sponsor the Confirmation Sponsor Form he/she will need to complete and return to St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church. If your sponsor is a parishioner of STA, use the STA form, if not use the GENERIC form.

Activity 2: Baptism and Confirmation

- Step 1: Candidate, please review with your parents and your Sponsor the questions listed below. If you have questions, refer to "What is Confirmation" (pg. 3) from the Parent Resource
- Step 2: As a family complete the Question section and then have a similar discussion with your Sponsor.
- **Step 3:** Candidate completes the reflection sheet entitled Reflection on the Sacraments of Initiation

- 7. How do you expect Confirmation to affect your life?

Activity 3: Saints

- **Step 1:** Parents/Sponsor discuss and list as many Saints possible with your teen
- **Step 2:** As family research or discuss different Saints. Pick the top three and fill out chart.
- **Step 3:** Candidate uses the information to choose a Saint for Confirmation and completes the worksheet

If your baptismal name is that of a recognized saint of the Church, there is no need to select a new name for Confirmation unless you want. Using the baptismal name for Confirmation is preferred because it highlights the relationship between the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

If you choose to take a new name for Confirmation, however, it should be a name selected in honor of Jesus or Mary or from the list of recognized saints of the Catholic Church. Names of saints are chosen to serve as patrons and models for those being confirmed. You should choose a patron whose Christian life and virtues can be imitated. You may also choose the saint who celebrates their Feast Day on your birthday, i.e. the Feast of St. Joseph is March 19.

- **Step 3:** Candidate writes a short reflection (2-3 paragraphs) on any part of the Mass on the Reflection on Mass sheet



Being a Disciple – Those who accepted Jesus' message to follow Him. Disciples share in the mission, joy, and suffering of Christ.

Jesus calls all of us to be His disciples. Being a disciple means participating in the mission of Christ to be a leader and witness to Him in our world. We are sustained in this mission by our relationship with Him. It doesn't matter who we are, where we have been, what we have done, or how "holy" we perceive ourselves to be. Christ calls everyone to follow Him – when he was preaching he called on tax collectors, sinners, prostitutes, Pharisees, rich and poor. Christ calls and challenges us continually. We are called to a different standard than what the world sets, and we are called to share our faith in Christ with others.

What Is Catholic Discipleship?

Conscious Choice

One of the characteristics of Catholic discipleship is that it requires a conscious choice about pursuing a Christian life. Therefore, it is a commitment that involves more than merely attending Mass and other Catholic observances in a passive manner. The Catholic who demonstrates discipleship exercises discipline in pursuing spiritual observances -- such as prayer or fasting -- as well as good works. Indeed, all aspects of the Christian life are to be performed with a sense of purpose.

Being a Disciple

Catholic discipleship also requires that the individual be willing to use his talents and blessings in building the "Kingdom of God," which is the goal of all Christian activity on earth. Since talents and blessings are seen as coming from God, the Catholic disciple is expected to be unselfish in using these for appropriate purposes. Another mark of discipleship is an unwillingness to resort to excuses to explain inaction or poor performance. The true Catholic disciple is expected to follow through on all Christian commitments.

- Comfort the sorrowful (afflicted) Walk with others through their pain.
 Encourage those who seem discouraged. Offer sympathy to those who are grieving.
- Bear wrongs patiently- Try not to be critical. Overlook other's mistakes.
 Assume the best of others.
- Forgive all injuries (offenses) Pray for those who have hurt you and pray for the grace to forgive. Let go of grudges. Be kind, even if your kindness is not returned.
- Pray for the living and the dead Keep a list of those for whom you promise to pray. Visit the graves of loved ones. Pray for those who have helped you in your life.

Beatitudes
